As the Malaysian Lactation Consultants Association (MALCA), a collective group of International Board of Certified Lactation Consultants (IBCLCs) in Malaysia, we are proud to stand in solidarity with the global breastfeeding community in observance of World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) 2024 Celebration.

This year's WBW theme is "Closing the Gap: Breastfeeding Support for All." The phrase "closing the gap" refers to reducing inequalities in breastfeeding support.
